

Re Feasibility into 2nd platform at Yeoford Station petition

Thank you for your petition in respect of the above, which has been passed to me to respond.

Although Devon County Council has led on the delivery of new stations across the County in recent years, many of the rail network investment decisions sit with Network Rail and the Department for Transport, therefore I have discussed the potential for this scheme with colleagues in the rail industry to understand whether there is likely to be a strategic case for such investment at Yeoford Station.

Yeoford Station currently benefits from an hourly service to Exeter, which is a good level of service for a settlement of its size. According to pre-pandemic figures, at its peak annual patronage at this station was approximately 18,000 passengers, which equates to between 20 and 30 passengers using the railway per day. With Exeter being the County's strategic centre for employment, retail, education and culture, it is reasonable to assume that the demand for travel into Exeter would be higher than the demand for travel into Okehampton. It would therefore be challenging to make a strong value for money economic case for investment in a new platform and bridge at Yeoford based on the anticipated limited rail passenger demand between Yeoford and Okehampton.

Furthermore, the Dartmoor Line reopening has significantly enhanced rail services to/from Crediton, which as of this Summer will have hourly services to Okehampton and half hourly frequency trains to Exeter. The rail passengers generated both from Okehampton and Crediton all helped strengthen the business case for the significant investment in the railway. We will need to understand what impact the increased frequency will have on rail patronage including on nearby rail stations as this may result in some rail users in the Yeoford rural area being attracted to make use of the Crediton Park and Ride with greater timetable flexibility.

The other key factors in making a compelling business case for the Dartmoor Line was the ability to offer competitive journey times by rail compared to car between Okehampton and Exeter. Network Rail have indicated that introducing additional stops on the Dartmoor Line will slow end-to-end journey times between Okehampton and Exeter and could impact on mode shift from car to rail. Based on the limited rail passenger demand between Yeoford and Okehampton the disbenefits to Okehampton rail users would likely be greater than the benefits of introducing an additional stop at Yeoford.

Textphone: 0845 155 1020 www.devon.gov.uk At the current time, the County Council is using its limited feasibility funding resources to focus efforts on progressing the business case for new passing loops on the West of England (Exeter to Waterloo) line. This would facilitate extension of rail services on the Barnstaple line (including Crediton Station) through to Axminster in East Devon. Cross city connectivity for communities in North and Mid Devon would be improved, expanding leisure, employment and education opportunities and East Devon towns on the railway would benefit from increased frequency of local rail services to and from Exeter.

Although this will come as a disappointment, I hope the reasons for not pursuing the feasibility study are clear as based on the evidence of existing passenger use of Yeoford station and considering potential demand for travel to Okehampton, we do not think that there is a sufficiently strong strategic and economic case for a second platform. Also, with limited funding resources, the County Council is prioritising other rail projects, which will provide greater benefit to a larger proportion of Devon's residents.

Yeoford Station Petition

I acknowledge your mail of 7th March which you correctly assumed was hugely disappointing. I cannot let it pass without making the following comments.

The petition was not primarily about increased services to Exeter (a merely incidental benefit) but about *facilitating* travel to Okehampton for the residents not only of Yeoford but of hamlets and villages including Colebroke, Coleford, Penstone, Neopardy, Woodland Head, Binneford and Hittisleigh. Who is to say how many would like to travel to Okehampton; do the operators not wish to fill those near- empty carriages in off-peak times and increase revenues? No doubt part of the Council's strategy is to move travel from road to rail and yet you are suggesting that potential users of the Dartmoor Railway travel to Crediton on narrow (and desperately potholed) roads.

I find your comment regarding 'disbenefits' to Okehampton rail users to be merely specious. It has been used by operators on the Tarka Line in the past to justify reduced services and the making of most stations request stops. Are train services not there to pick up passengers? Would Exeter/Okehampton travellers be so seriously disadvantaged by the stop of a few minutes at Yeoford, by request? I note with great interest that some Okehampton trains stop at Newton St Cyres.

We all need reminding of course, as retiring Councillor Nick Way pointed out to your Council in 2021, that £250,000 was allocated some while ago from the 'Invest in Devon' fund to be used at Yeoford but was diverted elsewhere.

I intend to put our correspondence in the public domain.

Save Money Help the Planet Share Your Car Journey With Someone Else

With the price of petrol rising there couldn't be a better time to start carsharing. Sustainable Crediton are launching a campaign to get Crediton and surrounding villages carsharing. It's good for the environment, the community and the people who take part. Devon County Council have a Devon wide Carsharing community with the company Lift share. To get started go to carsharedevon.com then just follow the instructions. Be sure to follow the instruction to activate your account through your email. If you prefer you can get the Liftshare app on your phone. It's called Liftshare Companion in your app store and it's free. You can then join Carshare Devon through the app. There are even separate communities for certain places of work like the RD&E. It can be used for both regular and one off journeys. You can have message conversations with potential matches to make arrangements or to get a sense if you feel good about sharing a car with this person. You could even meet up beforehand if you want.

Carsharing can save you money. Carshare will give a suggested contribution the passenger can contribute but of course its up to you. For example its suggested a return trip Crediton to Exeter would have a contribution of £2.00. So five days a week that's a saving of about £460 pounds in a year. If the passenger would otherwise take the bus they would be saving about the same. You can, if you both have cars, take turns with driving and each also save on wear and tear .Of course you can also have more than one passenger.

Carsharing can make a big contribution to reducing your personal and our communal carbon footprint. Its estimated that sharing a weekly commute between Exeter and Crediton with one other person for a year saves 950kg of CO2. That's like 42 extra trees doing their amazing work at cleaning our atmosphere.

Lots of people report that they have really enjoyed meeting new people and having company on their journeys.

With all the new house building in Crediton and surrounds the roads, especially at commuting times, will get more congested. Liftsharing can go a long way to easing these problems.

The website and app have lots of FAQs to answer your questions and help you get started. Its worth putting in your journey multiple times because the logarithms brain is limited and won't pick up that you would travel through somewhere. For example if you live in Yeoford and are going to Exeter you might also put in Crediton to Exeter to pick up lifts.
