

### County Councillor Newsletter

As winter approaches we are all very fearful of what our energy bills, our food bills and other expenditure will be. It is no different for the three levels of councils town/parish, district or county. You may have seen in the press a plea from councillor John Hart the leader of Devon County Council asking Central Government for better funding for counties. Funding cascades from central government to county then district and then your parish or town council. County and district council tax demands are capped which means that if those councils are to balance the books one of two things needs to happen an increase to the limit or the probable withdrawal of non-mandatory services. Although parish and town councils are not capped they have fairly limited powers.

With all this doom and gloom I am pleased to announce that this morning I received an e-mail from the leader of Devon County Council to say that we can now start spending what remains of our locality fund. I have just under £6000 left! So I advise those community groups in my division who are looking to plan things for the community that they have a word with me and also check on the Devon County Council website to see what the criteria for a locality fund grant are.

I have been able to carry out my surgeries most Saturdays, only missing when I was away from the area. So far the weather has not stopped me but I do have to say that with the advent of colder wetter weather it may be difficult for me to carry out my surgeries that are in the open so to speak. Here I am speaking of Cheriton Bishop and Copplestone. All I can say is if I don't appear and you have a problem do please e-mail me or give me a call. Everybody has my details by now I am sure.



### CREDITON HAMLETS PARISH COUNCIL

At the October Crediton Hamlets Parish Council meeting councillors discussed the suggestion of the Electoral Review Committee (ERC) that the number of parish councillors representing the Yeo Ward (which includes Yeoford) should be increased from five to seven. This would increase the total number of parish councillors from nine to eleven. The ERC had explained that the suggestion was based on population in the Ward. After consideration councillors resolved to comment to the ERC that they did not support the proposed increase because:

the Yeo Ward already has five of the nine councillors;

- the Yeo Ward therefore controls a majority on the council; and
- when vacancies have occurred in the Yeo Ward there has never been sufficient applicants to trigger an election

Councillors noted that the ERC had responded to a suggestion that Yeoford should have its own parish council by explaining that its terms of reference did not include a provision to create new parishes and therefore it was the ERC's view that Yeoford should remain in the parish of Crediton Hamlets.

Cllr Yarnold updated councillors on the proposed bus shelter for Yeoford. He has found a potential site opposite Yeoford Meadows. Cllr Yarnold will now discuss this with the bus service provider(s) and the Clerk will contact MDDC to check whether planning consent will be required.

The next meeting will be on Monday 7th November at the Boniface Centre, Crediton. If you would like to read the full minutes of the October Parish Council meeting they are on the PC website. The Parish Council is very aware of ongoing concerns about speeding

through Yeoford. Councillors have supported the 20 is Plenty for Us campaign and requested a 20mph speed limit in Yeoford. As for many other villages, Devon County Council did not approve this request. The Wheelie Bin stickers are a poor second best but perhaps better than nothing.



### **AVIAN INFLUENZA (Bird Flu)**

On 17 October 2022 an Avian Influenza Prevention Zone was declared by the Government across the whole of England. This was because of the increased number of cases of the disease across the country.

All bird keepers (whether they have pet birds, commercial flocks or just a few birds in a backyard) are now required by law to take a range of precautions to protect their flocks. (Jeyes fluid is a Defra approved disinfectant for Avian Influenza).

There are minimum requirements for all bird keepers to follow. If your birds are not housed, they must be kept in fenced / enclosed outdoor areas. Precautions include (amongst others): feeding birds under cover where wild birds cannot access, preventing access by captive birds to ponds and watercourses, and effectively cleansing and disinfecting any hardstanding surfaces in areas where birds are kept.

Further enhanced measures apply for premises with over 500 poultry or other captive birds.

Full details of what is required can be found on the government website - www.gov.uk/guidance/avian-influenza-bird-flu#AIPZ

You can find a self-assessment checklist at the above link to help you put the measures in place, as well as more information about the virus.

You can keep up to date by regularly visiting the avian influenza section on the government website, and by registering for email or text alerts www.gov.uk/guidance/apha-alert-subscription-service

Remember that if you have poultry/captive birds it is your responsibility to keep updated on any outbreaks and an easy way to do this is by signing up for text notifications – register with the APHA alerts service.

If you have any concerns about the health of your birds, you should promptly speak to your vet.

The risk to public health from the virus is very low, however it is important that people don't pick up sick or dead birds. You can report finding dead wild waterfowl (swans, geese or ducks) or other dead wild birds, such as birds of prey, to the DEFRA helpline on 03459 335577.

### **AVIAN INFLUENZA PREVENTION ZONE**

### REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL POULTRY AND CAPTIVE BIRD KEEPERS

- Keep free-ranging birds in fenced areas to minimise contact with wild birds, neigbouring poultry or captive birds.
- Inspect outdoor areas, removing wild bird contaminants like faeces, feathers and wild bird carcases.
- Fence off or put netting over areas of standing water or ponds.
- ✓ Provide feed and water undercover, so wild birds can't access it.
- Make your premises unattractive to wild birds. Use bird scarers, foils or streamers.
- Keep ducks and geese separate from other poultry.
- Store bedding under cover to reduce the risk of contamination.
- Clean and disinfect footwear before and after tending to your birds. If you own more than 50 birds, place foot dips containing Government approved disinfectant at all entry and exit points.
- Clean and disinfect hard surfaces regularly.
- Clean and disinfect equipment and vehicles to avoid disease spread between premises.
- Minimise the movement of people, vehicles and equipment to and from bird areas and keep records of movements.
- ✓ Keep records of poultry, captive bird and egg movements.
- Maintain buildings that house birds to prevent water ingress
- Ensure pest control is effective.





Non-compliance with these biosecurity measures may be an offence.

The café continues on Mondays at 10-11am in church when there is no community lunch.



### **YEO!CIDER 2022**

'You must be mad, going ahead with the cider festival on a rail strike day,' one villager said a few days before the first Yeo Cider since the pandemic. And we nearly agreed, on a sunny Saturday when we opened the doors to an eerily quiet village. It was a massive relief when our first customers turned up at



around 1130, six of whom had bussed and taxied from South Devon. From then on a trickle of customers turned into a flow, with many resilient supporters walking, cycling, bussing and getting lifts in to support us from as far afield as Barnstaple, Honiton and beyond to sample our wonderful selection of local ciders.

Our most popular ciders, Sandford Orchard Hangy Downs, Lily's rhubarb and Snail's Bank—Very Perry, which (ironically) had been voted the best cider at the festival, were swift to go. Our one real ale, Silver Bullet, supplied by the Beer Engine, barely lasted into the early evening.

By two o clock, the hall was buzzing with happy people. Our live music began, as ever provided by the talented Rob Murch and Busker Bernie, while our customers were content to stay and enjoy the cheerful atmosphere, feasting on burgers supplied by the Brimacombe family and Dee's delicious scotch eggs and sausage rolls.




Had there not been a train strike, we would have easily run out of cider by 4pm, one staff member said. In the end we had over 160 customers and initial accounts suggest we have made over £1,600 towards the running of the hall, keeping hire costs down for our local user groups, a fantastic amount for a highly enjoyable day.
