





YEOFEST 2023 SATURDAY 11TH MARCH

Over 320 people braved the drizzle to attend the 13th Yeofest, the first Yeoford beer festival since before the pandemic. Enthusiastic customers began queuing before the bar opened at 11:30 with the hall filled by merry drinkers by lunchtime, the furthest traveller had only landed from Australia the day before!

18 beers were carefully selected for Yeofest this year, reflecting award winning ales, local breweries and interesting beers from Birmingham, Bristol, Cornwall, Derby and Liverpool. With a mixture of stouts, golden ales, best bitters and milds, it was deemed by many customers to be the best selection of beers Yeofest has ever had. By 3pm the first beer, William Mucklow's Dark Mild was sold out, with others close behind. Also showing strong sales were local beers from Bays Brewery, The Beer Engine and Utopian Brewery.

The afternoon proceeded with a backdrop of music from Rob Murch and Busker Bernie. Beer flowed into the evening, when remaining punters were treated to 80s synth covers by village band Yeo Division.

POTHOLES IN THE PARISH A MESSAGE FROM COUNCILLOR JOHN STEVENS, CHAIR OF CREDITON HAMLETS PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council is frequently contacted by residents who are frustrated by the state of roads in the parish – potholes, blocked drains, leaves on the road...I could go on! Please rest assured that we do report all contacts to Cllr Letch (your Devon County Councillor) at our meetings and we know that he in turn reports all issues to DCC Highways. We are as frustrated as everyone at the lack of action from DCC Highways.

The more a problem with roads is reported to DCC Highways, the more likely they are to do something. DCC will only accept reports via the Report a Problem page on its website: **Report a problem - Roads and transport (devon.gov.uk)**. This covers potholes, blocked drains, defective road markings and other issues. The specific page for potholes is: **Report a pothole - Devon County Council**. Note the restrictive definition of a pothole!

If you are aware of a pothole or other problem on our local roads PLEASE do report it DCC Highways on the DCC website, either as a new problem or as an interested party on an existing problem.

CREDITON HAMLETS PARISH COUNCIL

At the March Parish Council meeting the clerk apologised that details of how to apply to become a Crediton Hamlets Parish Councillor at the May elections had not appeared in the Village Voice. The information was already on the Parish Council website and would as soon as possible be put on the Yeoford Hub. Posters would be put up on the village noticeboard.

The clerk reported that DCC Highways had approved the location of a new grit bin in Yeoford. It will be near the telephone box on Station Road. The Parish Council will purchase the bin, position it and arrange for it to be filled. As this bin is not being provided by DCC, their Highways team will not re-fill it. When it is empty residents should therefore contact the clerk or a parish councillor to arrange for grit to be delivered.

Councillors further discussed the new bus shelter for Yeoford but no decisions were made. This issue will be on the April agenda. Councillors also discussed proposals for a bring and share lunch in Yeoford to celebrate the upcoming coronation. It was agreed to check whether the Yeoford Community Hall committee had any plans. Also for further discussion at the April meeting.

Councillor Yarnold reported that he had been contacted by a resident who wanted to claim against DCC for damage to a car caused by a pothole. The resident had obtained a claim form and received payment. The clerk was asked to publicise details of how to make a claim. Parishioners can obtain a claim form by calling DCC on **0345 155 104** or emailing them on **csc.roads@devon.gov.uk**.

Cllr Stevens reported on fly-tipping near Neopardy. He will arrange removal.

Finally, due to the elections on 4th May, the May Parish Council meeting cannot be held on the usual first Monday of the month. It was agreed that the meeting would instead be held at Yeoford Community Hall on the 15th of May and be immediately preceded by the Annual Parish Meeting and the Annual Parish Council meeting. So many meetings! Clerk to advertise in the May Village Voice and on the Yeoford Hub.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on Monday 3rd April at the Boniface Centre, Crediton. The meeting will commence at 7.30 pm. If you would like to read the full minutes of the March Parish Council meeting, they are on the PC website. Please contact one of your councillors or Rachel Hodder, the Parish Clerk (clerk@creditonhamlets.org.uk or 01363 85523), if there is something you would like to have discussed at the next Council meeting.
