

Crediton has a Hash House Harriers group (Kennel)...KH3

Here is a bit of History to give you an Idea if you might like to try something new at this friendly club.

The Hash House Harriers began in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, in 1938, when a group of restive British company men started a hare & hounds r*nning group. They named the group after their meeting place, the Selangor Club, aka the "Hash House." Hash House Harrier r*ns were patterned after the traditional British public school paper chase. A "Hare" would be given a short head start to blaze a trail, marking his devious way with shreds of paper, soon to be pursued by a shouting pack of "Harriers." Only the Hare knew where he was going. the Harriers followed his marks to stay on trail. Apart from the excitement of chasing down the wily Hare, solving the Hare's marks and reaching the end was its own reward, for there, thirsty Harriers would find a tub of iced-down beer.

Hashing died during World War II (Japanese occupying forces being notoriously opposed to civilian fun), but came back to life in the post-war years, spreading slowly through Singapore, Indonesia, Australia, and New Zealand, then exploding in popularity in the late 70s and early 80s. Today there are thousands of Hash House Harrier clubs in all parts of the world, complete with newsletters, directories, and regional and world Hashing conventions.

Despite its growth, Hashing hasn't strayed far from its British and Malaysian roots. A typical Hash "kennel" is a loosely organized group of 20-40 men and women who meet weekly or biweekly to chase the Hare. We follow chalk, flour, or sawdust, and the trails are never boring. When forced to, we'll r*n streets or alleys, but in general we prefer shiggy...fields, forests, jungles, swamps, streams, fences, storm drains, and cliffs. And although some of today's health-conscious Hashers may shun a cold beer in favor of water or a diet soda, trail's end is still a party. Perhaps that's why they call us the "drinking club with a r*nning problem!".

The two higher tier councils on which I sit have a wide range of responsibilities and yet it all seems to come down to highways and potholes! Research has shown that it is not just the Devon issue but the roadworks throughout Britain are in a poor state through lack of funding.

There have been so many complaints raised at full council in County that we have received an email from councillor Stuart Hughes, the Cabinet member for Highway Management, who has set out the challenges and responses. In brief there have been 35,000 pothole assessments registered since January of this year. April proved to be a bad month because it is usually one where we start to get on top of the works but heavy rain only increased the number of potholes. Over the winter there were 40 teams across the county dedicated to repairing our roads. We now have five Dragon patches, these are lorries that do all in one. They have been working double shifts with the early morning and late night daylight hours. At the present just over 800 potholes are on the contractor Milestone's register to repair which is down from 3000 earlier in the year.

Locally I have had some success with the filling of the potholes on the main roads into Hittisleigh. This followed my rant at a highways meeting in early June. Sadly I have not been as successful with the problems in Bow where the three parties, highways, South West Water and Bow Water do not seem to agree on a way forward. I raised the terrible road conditions outside the farm shop in Copplestone and have recently been informed that it will be repaired in the budget year 2024/ 25. It seems that the current budget is fully allocated.

In County the main budget areas are children's services and adult social care but as it does not seem to affect many people it is almost disregarded by the public. This is sad because much of our debt comes from these two services and this reflects on your precept.

County is looking at changing the way it works and has instigated a governance review committee of which I am one of the five members! We shall be meeting twice every month until May 2024! This is quite a commitment I think you must agree. I'm also on two committees that centre on equality and diversity and inclusion. The committees are at district and county level.

It is good to be able to report that Mid Devon is making progress in its zero carbon quest. The two leisure centres with swimming pools have ground source heat pumps and are also having solar panels fitted. There is also a campaign of improving the housing stock with retro insulation and other such measures. So it is not all doom and gloom.

For the sporty members of the community I can announce that Mid Devon has launched a new leisure hub which gives members a personalised account for such things as booking.

With the climate change we have seen long dry spells followed by very heavy rain and subsequent floods in our streets. May I urge you to check any drains near your property and report them on the Devon County website so that they can be cleared?

CREDITON HAMLETS PARISH COUNCIL

At the July Parish Council meeting Councillors were pleased to hear that Cllr Letch (DCC) had arranged to "tour" local roads with the DCC Highways Officer. Councillors Price and Yarnold arranged to join the "tour" so that they could point out specific potholes and road damage in the Parish and also discuss the site of the proposed bus shelter, which has to be approved by DCC.

Cllr Letch reported on DCC plans to introduce parking meters on Crediton High Street. The charges are not yet agreed but it is thought they will be in the region of £1 to £1.50 for a 90 minute stay. Councillors expressed concern that this will reduce footfall on the High Street and therefore be detrimental for local businesses, just at a time that they need support. Councillors were also concerned that drivers would park on nearby residential streets.

Cllr Brimacombe reported on Network Rail's works near Station Road to the stabilise the railway bank. The works will run from 17th July to the end of September. Network Rail should have written to all nearby properties. ° M
