



County Councillor Newsletter—August

My round of surgeries in the parishes has proved once again to be disappointing. These surgeries take some time not just the drive there but to spend an hour or so waiting for people to turn up so I am considering if this is a good use of my time. I can always be contacted by phone or email.

Last week I attended the Highways and Traffic Order Committee (HATOC for short) where we discussed the ever growing problem of potholes, poor road surfaces, cleaning and jetting of drains. During the summer months there has been some progress on road repairs I'm glad to report. These will continue especially as the schools are closed and so we do not have the 16 or so buses running around the area. I did raise my concerns about schoolchildren and traffic! This came about because I had an e-mail from a concerned grandmother who was taking her child to school in Crediton and was luckily on hand to prevent her being hit by a reversing van. I spoke about this with the officers and suggested that we should visit all schools over the next few months to see what the road conditions are and how quickly the traffic is travelling. One solution I have is traffic calming measures, 20 mile an hour signs with a flashing light above coming on at the peak school hours and in some cases closing the road during the peak morning and afternoon periods if there is an alternative routes that can be used.

You may have seen the uproar about closing the mobile library service in order to save £217,000. The other day a mobile library van went through Crediton and I saw that it had a 56 plate which means that it is 17 years old. This is one of the problems, the five vans are old and expensive to maintain. In Crediton they have a very good volunteer service where people take books out to those in isolated areas. I think we need to think creatively about helping our rural communities and maybe taking up some of the money the county is going to save if it does close the mobile library service.

Looking around the Devon county council website I've seen that there are a few very useful links. There is a Growing Community fund which can be accessed online by e-mailing communitygrants@devon.gov.uk.

You may be aware that Co-Cars is going into administration. It was set up a few years ago with a grant of £222,000 from Devon County's transport plan funding, which was matched by a government grant. At the moment they are looking for some other group to take over the project.

Walking around Crediton and some of the villages I'm quite disturbed by the amount of weeds growing on the pavements and in the gutters. It is clear that the two higher tier councils are unable to do very much because of budget constraints so could I encourage us all to look after the pavement in front of our house and do our best to keep it clear. We must also encourage shopkeepers to do the same and help those of our neighbours who might find this difficult!



Parish Voluntary Wildlife Warden

Hello, I trained as a voluntary wildlife in October 2022 and are here to help with any nature related matter or query.

If its a crime being committed please try to take pictures and you should phone 101 and report it to the police who have a wildlife officer.

I am linking in with the Parish Council, our district Councillors, the Exe Rivers project and Sustainable Crediton to promote local plans supporting wildlife. I will be testing 2 waterway points, joining an existed team of local testers in the Parish and I am attempting to highlight damage to hedgerow banks in the lanes. There is a Crediton Parish Hamlets Nature Group on Facebook.

As a new resident in the Parish I am taking time to explore the Parish on foot. So one Sunday morning early in August I set off from Binneford for a circular walk to Hittesleigh across to Hittersleigh Mill and back to Binneford, in the extreme west of the Parish. It was the day after big north westerly winds but little but leaves and wild apples had been thrown down.

To my left the river Yeo valley snaked away up a sunny valley pass the old farm. Residents tell me the old drovers path and the woods beyond are overgrown and inaccessible due to fallen trees. A kingfisher visits their ponds.

The Hittesleigh lane was still abundant with wildflowers; fleabane, lesser knapweed and meadow sweet predominantly. They were covered in meadow browns red admiral and peacock butterflies sheltering from the still strong wind.

From Eastchurch a footpath cuts down across set aside land to a seasonal brook at the edge of a the woods that stretch down to the Yeo valley floor. Again a thicket of fallen trees and fill of young holly. Deer prints were visible in the mud but too old to tell me much. All was silent in the dark depths.

At Hittesleigh Mill at the edge of a conifers plantation residents again report seeing a kingfisher and seeing a goshawk hunting, taking a crow from the nest. Access to the valley from this end was again limited to a 100m edge. Water is being tested here as part of the citizenship science Rivers project.

Rejoining the parish at Hook Farm above Binneford I was struck by the wealth and health of tall native hedges. Holly blue butterflies abounded clouds of meadow browns fed on on gateway knapweed and a silver washed fritillary alighted, the first I have seen, a lover of mature oak woodlands bramble flowers and violets.

Returning to the Ford at Binneford surrounded by oak woods and tree lined open pasture I headed back to the heights past ancient oak and holly woodlands filled with bird song in the afternoon sunshine. An Argent Moth and a Garden Tiger Moth disturbed by the wind settled on old timber in the hedge as we passed by. An end to a long and steep walk with barely a glimpse of the upper Yeo Valley. I can only imagine the wonders it hold in its tangled sides.

This corner of the Parish is a truly amazing place full of wild places and undisturbed areas of woodland ,meadows, rough ground and waterways.
