



County Councillor Newsletter—September

August is a very quiet month as few councils at any level have any meetings. With this in mind I decided to take a 10 day holiday break. I took no iPhone nor iPad and existed in uncontactable bliss! I spent a week in Germany where I was very impressed with the public transport system, the abundance of solar panels, pothole free roads and drains that were actually clear enough to let water run down them when we had those occasionally heavy showers! How different to Devon. What are we doing wrong? How can we improve? I do have a few ideas following my visit and will discuss them with the various officers at Mid Devon and Devon Council; I shall keep you informed. Travel they say broadens the mind and it certainly opened my eyes to what can be achieved.

There has been some progress locally on the state of the roads because there has been some patching done in Crediton and a good repair at the bottom of Station Road in Bow! I have lost count of how many e-mails, phone calls and even face-to-face talks I have had over the disgraceful condition of the road in Bow. But it is done and that is the important thing.

At the beginning of August I had a drive around some of my division with our highways officer. It was a very interesting experience pointing out the faults to him and having other faults pointed out to me. These were all logged down and we just hope that sometime there will be sufficient money to make some progress. I hope to do another "tour" in September. We did at least least finalise a site for the bus shelter in Yeoford, and I have promised a contribution of £500 from my council locality fund.

It will be interesting to see what happens to the mobile library service. I attended a parish council meeting in Coldridge with Natalia, my wife, as she is the district ward member. The main topic of the meeting was the mobile library service which is very well used in the village. We were both surprised at the number of people who turned up. It seems that there has been a wide consultation and we must now wait for any ideas that come from it.

Just as August has been a quiet month I look at my diary and see that September is already filling up and so I will have more to relate to you next month. Enjoy the rest of summer.

At the September Parish Council meeting Cllr Chenore (MDDC) updated councillors on plans for the 2023 Festival of Light, including a carol procession by school children and the Christmas Lights competition. Councillors asked the Clerk to put this on the October agenda for discussion. All councillors agreed the Parish Council supports this initiative.

PROJECT ENTERS NEW P

Crediton Library's Reminiscence Project is set to enter a new phase, thanks to 🍘 funding from The National Lottery Heritage Fund. The funding, made possible by money raised by National Lottery players, will allow the library to continue gathering and preserving memories of Crediton and the surrounding areas.

③ So far, in partnership with the Folklore Library and Archive, the library has collected 🍞 and made available a number of memories of the local area. These include necollections of life during World War Two, stories of farming and growing up in the countryside, as well as living through rapidly changing times. There are memories of the first lady to receive antibiotics in Crediton, life before mobile phones and a resident's memories of getting their first colour TV.

Parish Voluntary Wildlife Warden

On Sunday last I awoke to torrential rain. I'd hoped to continue my walk from last month onwards from Binneford to Woodhead today but as yet the rain shows no sign of stopping.

We have certainly had extremes of weather this week both heat and rain. It is undeniable that the climate is changing.

So how is nature coping with our extremes of weather? The trees seemed to have coped well, the oaks and apples the best. The bees had a bad start with a cold spring but bounced back in August along with the butterflies, I've seen more Holly Blues this year than ever before.

Coming home in the middle of September I was greeted by a whirling cloud of Housemartins climbing high on a thermal, so exciting was this to see that I didn't think to count but there were more than a few, there were lots. Swallow and Housemartins seem to have had a good year, let's hope that they survive their long journey to Africa and back.

And still the rain falls. Much needed I know, and with the wet, mushrooms will be emerging in our woodlands and their fringes. These are the 'flowers' of a huge underground network of filaments. Interconnecting, feeding and being fed by the surrounding trees and plants. Together they form a Wild Wood Web. From sharing water and nutrients to alerting plants of pests approaching and triggering defences, the Wild Web senses and responds.

At dusk the clouds had lifted and all was quiet. Looking out at the last of the light in the sky from the doorstep I saw a Barn Owl come over the field. Sweeping back and forth 3 or 4 times before flitting up and over the trees and away. A moment of magic after a dreary day.

Now that Autumn is here could you consider not tidying your gardens completely this year? This will help support overwintering creatures and give wildlife the best start in Spring. Paths and grass need to be kept clear of leaves to be safe but leave them on flower beds and under hedges and far corners. Try not to cut back flowerbeds until late February.

Also there will be a family nature walk in Yeoford on the 8th October. Get in touch if you are interested in coming along.
