

CREDITON HAMLETS PARISH COUNCIL

At the November Parish Council meeting Cllr Frank Letch (DCC) reported that he had contacted DCC and MDDC regarding damage to the bridge at Neopardy. As the bridge is Grade 2 listed, MDDC can only make limited alterations without obtaining planning and listed building consent. However, DCC are trying to rejig the construction and reinforce the dislodged rails without the need for consents. Cllr Sandy Chenore (MDDC) had submitted a written report which will be published on the Parish Council's website. Her plans for the the Yeoford Festival of Light have come together and she hopes to be able to consult residents of Yeoford about plans for a mural on the railway bridge in spring 2024.

Councillors reported that the base and blocks for the new bus shelter will be laid as soon as there is a dry spell of weather. Councillors resolved to make a grant of £300 to Citizens Advice, having been informed that in the last year Citizens Advice had supported 44 residents of the parish, helping with a total of 101 issues and generating substantial additional income. Councillors asked the Clerk to publicise Citizens Advice within the parish.

The Clerk reminded Councillors that the previously agreed five annual grants of £1000 to Yeoford Community Association for the upkeep of the play area had now all been paid. Councillors asked the Clerk to contact the Community Association to see if future grants are needed. To be discussed further at the December meeting when the budget for 2024/2025 will be considered.

The next full Council meeting will be on Tuesday 2nd January 2024. The time and venue will be confirmed on the Parish Council's website. If you would like to read the full minutes of the November Parish Council meeting, they are on the PC website. County Councillor Newsletter—November

As we come to the end of October councils at all three levels (County, District town or parish) will be looking at how much they have spent, how much is left in the kitty and how they can plan the budget for 2024/25. We councillors have already had a first look at a draft budget for county and district and I'm sure that the same will be happening in the towns and parishes. The top tier councils have their council tax capped at 2.99%. As we know inflation is well above that figure and so we can only expect some changes in the services provided. At county level this has already been seen at the proposed disbanding of the mobile library service, and I hear that they are also going to reduce the payments to foster carers!the Local Government Association has undertaken some investigations and finds that the county councils throughout England have the potential of a huge debt! They are encouraging the government to increase the support they give the counties; we can only hope that this does not fall on deaf ears!

As we all know roads are a considerable problem in Devon. The people of Copplestone have become totally fed up with the condition of the 2 A roads that run through the village. Despite what some people think I have been working very hard on this particular project but have come up against the usual wall of budget controls! We have got together a petition which I shall present to full council at its next meeting asking county highways to prioritise these 2 key roads for repair.

As a member of the children's scrutiny committee and an ex-teacher I am concerned at the level of education in Devon and in particular the overspend in provision for pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). In enquiring mode I have asked the portfolio holder for SEND for a breakdown of the overspend over the past 18 months, it is currently well over £140 million. I have asked for a progression of the overspending and for the plan to not only decrease it but paid it off by March 2026 which is the cut-off point!

Amongst all this doom and gloom there are two areas of encouragement. Figures in from the care sector shows that there has been increasing recruitment, which means that it is becoming easier for the county to find care packages for those people who are either in hospital or in need of care at home. The other piece of good news is for those who travel. The county is retaining the £2 fare for buses until December 2024. I hoppe that enough people take up the offer to keep some traffic off the roads and encourage this road congestion solution to continue for even longer.

SAVE THE CHAPEL CAR PARK

People of Yeoford and surrounding areas that park in The Chapel Car Park at Yeoford.

Are you aware that you have been using a parking area for many years opposite the Old Chapel (now under Offer for Change of Use to Residential) under the goodwill of the Trustee Group of the Chapel that has now passed back to the original owner Jack Shelley for Private Sale.

As a Community we are about to lose this much appreciated facility, which is mainly used for 'catching the train', in the absence of any GWR or Network Rail parking.

I have spoken to Parish Council on more than one occasion of the suggestion of them taking ownership...can we have a show of support for this well used facility to be kept in some way for the future of us all?

Please be aware that part of the existing car park is included with the sale of the Chapel so it will be vital to maintain any parking spaces we can rather than rail users (and others) just parking randomly in the village.

I will be attending the next Parish Council meeting to formally suggest they adopt this vital amenity but doubt I will have any success alone so any other help or suggestions would be greatly appreciated!

Parish Voluntary Wildlife Warden

Parish Walk November 23—A very short walk around an ancient oak tree.

The Price's of Woodland Head kindly invited me to visit the ancient oak at Rock Cross. It's a beautiful tree but surprisingly small. The die back of the crown and the hollowing of the trunk I could see from the lane suggested a greater age than the girth. But it is clearly over 400 years. Gnarled prominent roots with a narrow waist topped by a bulging base of ancient pollarding of its upper branches. Above this, three main branches, the centre one dead but the other 2 large and healthy. From the front it is complete but from the rear the rotting of its heartwood is clearly visible. One day it will split in 2 but not in our lifetimes.

Trees this old matter for wildlife. This tree has been here for age upon age. Unlikely to ever fall, even in its final years the oak will put out new growth. Generations of creatures have lived and died in this tree fed by fungi as old as it. Surveys could tell us more about its ecosphere but the life it supports just needs their tree, they don't need to know who they are. They just need to be. Over 2,300 wildlife species live in oak trees. They are the most hospitable of our native trees and oak woodlands are our most diverse. Our Parish is a haven for oak trees of some considerable age. Are there other ancient tree veterans in the Parish?

The old oak stays warm all winter, the ground frost free beneath his branches on all but the coldest days ,giving even the creatures of the soil the benefit of its warmth. As its leaves fall gently, large leaf buds are revealed heralding the spring. The Oak is the King of all our native trees.







