





CREDITON HAMLETS PARISH COUNCIL

At the December Parish Council meeting the Trustees of Yeoford Gospel Hall requested that the Parish Council take on responsibility for the cemetery beside the Chapel and the parking area opposite. The Trustees explained that the Chapel is now closed and to be developed as a dwelling. They now have no income for upkeep of the cemetery or the parking area. Members of the public spoke in support of the Parish Council taking on the parking area, which is used by parishioners and provides parking for train users. Councillors asked the Trustees to provide more detail so that they can make an informed decision. This issue will be discussed again at the February meeting.

Councillors discussed Neopardy Bridge, which is again in a poor state of repair with damage potentially being caused by wide farm vehicles. Action from DCC is awaited. Councillors resolved to make a grant of £200 towards the upkeep of the Holy Trinity Churchyard. Cllr Stevens reported that the new grit bin is in place near the phone box and that all village grit bins have been filled. A member of the Yeoford Community Association thanked the Parish Council for the grants it had made towards the Play Area over the past five years and explained that a grant was not needed this year. Cllr Yarnold reported that the base for the new bus shelter had been laid. The blockwork will be laid shortly and it is hoped the shelter will be built in January.

The next full Council meeting will be on Monday 5th February at The Boniface Centre in Crediton. If you would like to read the full minutes of the December Parish Council meeting, they are on the PC website. County Councillor Newsletter—December

November has been a quiet month for meetings but many decisions have been made at district, county and government level. The contract for road repairs, which is currently held by Milestone has been in operation since April 2017 and is due to run out in 2027. This ten-year contract has been worth £400 million and will be up for tender. County Cabinet is looking into setting up a scrutiny spotlight review in the spring to look at options for tendering such as just one company, several companies and length of contract.

While we're on the subject of road repairs it is encouraging to hear that the government is giving £6.66 million to Devon County for road improvements which is a by-product of the abandoning of the HS2 project. We shall all look with interest at how far this money goes on the 8000 miles of roads in Devon! On the 7th December I shall present a petition on behalf of Copplestone asking for the 2 A roads in the village to be repaired.

The mobile library saga is moving into its final phase. You will have seen several stars and other important people supported the idea of keeping the mobile library service. The senior scrutiny committee called the Cabinet decision in and put forward a list of ideas they thought Cabinet could pursue. Their suggestions went before Cabinet which decided that the service will discontinue at the end of February 2024; there will be £25,000 for transition to support vulnerable people and £15,000 to community groups and parishes to maintain an extra library service. Cabinet is also waiting for the Government's Public Libraries Strategy document, which would come out in spring 2024 and with this in mind they will produce a comprehensive library offer!

It is good to note that bus traveller numbers are up following the continuation of the £2 fare. How long this will continue nobody knows but it is a step in the right direction.

County have also joined with Essex County Council who will be their SEND partner. This council was in a similar position to Devon some years ago and has moved rapidly forward which we need to do.

Closer to home the pay and display in Crediton has had several turns. It was muted at first that the pay and display will be one half-hour free and a further half hour paid at £1. The latest statement from the Cabinet portfolio holder is that the first hour will be free and those who wish to stay an extra hour will have to pay £3. So the 45 minutes free parking is extended! This has taken a lot of negotiation believe me.

The final issue to hit the headlines is the Devolution Deal with Devon and Torbay. This has been given Government go-ahead and funding it seems will follow. It is hoped that the deal will encourage future investment and policy vital to the prosperity of our communities

County Councillor Newsletter—January

There is no doubt that December brings a rather different mood to council meetings. However I am rather concerned at the number of parish councillors which seems to vary greatly. I attended two parish council meetings; the meeting of Crediton Hamlets was attended by just about all councillors. Maybe they were attracted by the temptation of festive nibbles and drinks after the meeting! Copplestone was attended by just 3 councillors but that was the minimum allowed so the meeting went ahead. Sadly the meeting of Cheriton Bishop Parish Council had to be cancelled because there were not enough councillors to make the meeting quorate. I think we should make a new year's resolution for 2024 to increase the number of parish councillors to its full quota.


I did attend the Devon County Council full council meeting and from it picked up two very interesting cabinet member reports. The first followed questions that I asked about the overspend of SEND. The staggering projected overspend total is £162.6 million! In theory this has to be cleared by March 2026 but it seems there is a safety valve plan which involves discussion between the Department of Education and the county council. The council has plans to bring forward 20 projects but as yet no details. The aim of the projects is to bring the budget back in line and reduce the deficit over the next five years.

The other report was from the Cabinet member for highway management. This again contains some staggering figures. Since 1st April 2023 the council has received 1,229 claims for damages to vehicles or personal injuries due to road defects. The combined value of these claims is just over £1.1 million; to date £48,000 has been paid. Quite a difference between those two figures. On potholes the figures are again not very comforting. So far in this financial year 28,801 potholes have been reported. As of 1st December 2023 there were 1,505 potholes awaiting repair with the contractors. I hasten to add that not all of these are in our area! Ha ha!

You may have seen last week on Spotlight an interview with a Conservative member of the Cabinet and the leader of the Liberal Democrats on Devon County Council. Amazingly they were both singing from the same carol sheet, namely they were berating the interference of central government in local issues. The matter concerned an imminent government ruling (it becomes law on January 1st) that decrees that recycling centres must now take domestic DIY waste free of charge. This has several consequences. Firstly it will mean the loss of about £1 million of income, it will mean that the county council will have to dispose of the material, which comes at a cost. But there is perhaps one positive possibility in that it may reduce fly tipping of the DIY waste we often see around our country lanes.

I hope you all have an enjoyable Christmas and wish you all a happy new year. Do make some sensible new year's resolutions for 2024, resolutions that you can keep!
